



## Condition of Your Heart

Our hearts, in the right place, set us up for manifestation. We must believe with our heart and confess with our mouth. You can't speak differently to what's in your heart. When you gave your life to Jesus, how many times did you need to confess it? Just once. Why do we confess healing, prosperity, etc. over and over again? The question is; if we confess repeatedly, then do we really believe? Confession has become the very thing building up our unbelief because we're expecting that it might not happen. The pressures of life expose the real us and tests comes to determine the condition of our hearts. What we need to do is evaluate our heart and speak to the condition of it to help our unbelief. When we do this, our confession will change as a result of the change happening in our hearts.

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### A. Loving God

- a. The most important thing is loving God.
- b. Our greatest need is to know Him; that's what moves and motivates us.
- c. His thoughts towards us are about a destination. (Jeremiah 29:11)
- d. Along with loving God, we must love the things God wants to give us. Who are we to choose what we can take from God?
- e. To a child, a parent's love is the only thing that matters, but it must go beyond that.
- f. God's purpose in our lives is not just about salvation. (3 John 1:2)

### B. Out of the Abundance of the Heart

- a. Your heart must be in the right place – it sets you up for manifestation. If it's in the wrong place, you have no power and energy and therefore you'll make an excuse to separate the thing that requires you to manifest.
- b. Believe with your heart and confess with your mouth.
- c. When we face something in our lives and go through the water and fire, because of fear and intimidation, we draw back. (Hebrews 10:39)
- d. The children of Israel lacked faith with the message that was preached. (Hebrews 4:2)
- e. Our belief on who we are must change. (Hebrews 11:10)
- f. You can't experience an "above only" life if you're not seeking an above only. (No sin, sickness, disease, poverty and lack) (Deuteronomy 28:13)
- g. The man who makes an excuse for what's out there, never attracts what's out there; you only repel it.
- h. You can't speak differently to what's in your heart. (Proverbs 23:7, Luke 6:45)
- i. We must have the spirit of faith, where things like sickness become an impossibility to us.

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- j. The problem is that we have a lot of head knowledge.
- k. The pressures of life expose the real us. It steals the Word and tests who we are.

### C. Confession and the Heart

- a. Righteousness is not because you're saved.
- b. Salvation is dependent on two processes: believe with your heart and confess with your mouth.
- c. What was the character and nature of Jesus when He appeared to a person who was in need? Did He just keep confessing?
- d. We are not obtaining dynamic, quick results.
- e. How many times do you confess when you give your life to Jesus? Why do we confess over and over again with everything else in our lives?
- f. When we speak His Word, there should be results. It's a heart issue when there are no results.
- g. Jesus asked people one thing, do you believe?
- h. We tend to speak before we believe. We are reliant on speaking to believe. You cannot speak the things you want to manifest in your life if you're still working on believing it. (2 Corinthians 4:13)
- i. Evaluate the condition of your heart.
- j. The test comes to determine the condition of our hearts. The mouth becomes the qualifier for what's in our heart.
- k. When what's on the outside is not looking as it should, start speaking to your heart. (Mark 4:1-20)
- l. We call forth things today and again tomorrow because we don't believe.
- m. We must speak the Word to the condition of our heart.
- n. What we believe, we receive. The issue is not what we say, we receive; it's if we say it from what we believe.
- o. Confession has become the very thing building up our unbelief because we're expecting that it might not happen.
- p. We can't have faith unless our heart is sorted out. (Hebrews 11:1)
- q. God is about process and order; not magic.
- r. This message is hard; it exposes a person. (1 Samuel 16:7)
